#### Website News

One of our primary goals here at the Godfrey is to continue to add valuable content to the website. We're still adding cemeteries to the Laput Collection and are now up to 1048 Connecticut cemeteries. We've added a total of 43 family Bibles to the Bible collection. We added two sets of vital record books that are not covered in Barbour, those for Enfield and Mansfield. Ye Old Folks of **Connecticut** lists Connecticut people who were 80 or older in 1884, with full sketches of centenarians, and can be found in the local history section. We've put up two volumes of Connecticut men who fought in the French and **Indian War** in the "Military" section, and we're working on a multi-volume set of family group sheets from the Doud/Dowd family. Most recently we've just begun work on a 3-volume set of records on Connecticut soldiers in World War I.
