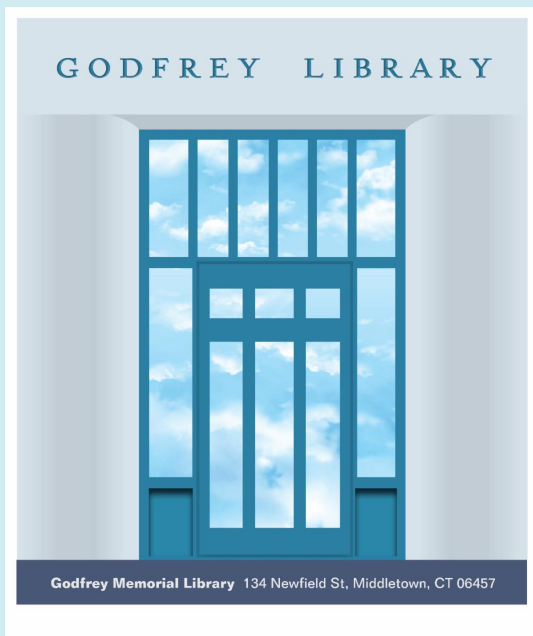

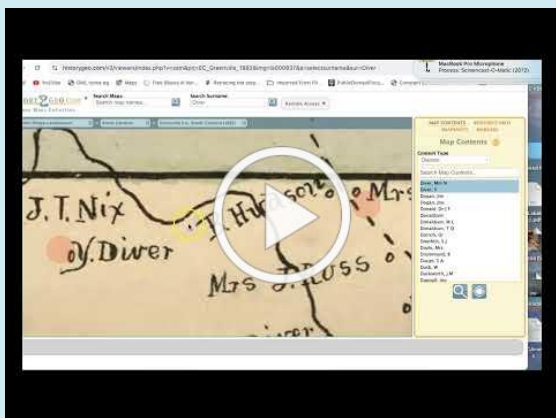
This month's Genealogy Club presentation: "Lineage Societies: How to Apply" with Al Fiacre

Over the years we have helped a number of people with their applications to organizations such as the DAR (Daughters of the American Revolution), the SAR (Sons of the American Revolution), the GSMD (Mayflower Society), The Society of the Cincinnati, and the Order of the Crown of Charlemagne, to name a few. Sometimes we just give a few hints and words of advice, but in many cases folks hire us to carry out some more research and to complete the application for them. Al will share advice on how to go about putting together a strong application. Even if you're not planning on applying in the near future, you'll undoubtedly learn something to help you in your research.


